Thomas Maynard, MD, installed as 155th Academy President

More than 150 attendees were on hand at the Academy of Medicine's Annual Meeting on September 20 for the installation of Thomas Maynard, MD, as president for the 2011–2012 term. Dr. Maynard was sworn in by outgoing President Barry Webb, MD.

In his presidential address, Dr. Maynard called on his physician colleagues to join together to reinvent the Academy of Medicine and keep it relevant in light of the ever-widening and diverging interests influencing the profession of medicine.

"The relevance of the Academy has always been its ability to act for not only its physician members but all community physicians in times of crisis," Dr. Maynard said. "Our founding physicians of the Academy of Medicine had marvelous vision in establishing this great political, ethical, and social professional organization for the benefit of all physicians. He went on to say, "We will not survive alone; hopefully we can embrace the necessary changes and flourish together."

As one of his first official duties, Dr. Maynard led the other Council members in taking the Oath of Office. New Mission Statement adopted

As a result of recent Strategic Planning activities, the Academy of Medicine Council voted to update the organization's Mission Statement. The new Mission Statement, adopted during the September Council meeting, reads, "The Academy of Medicine is the professional association that exists to organize, represent, advocate, and serve physicians of Greater Cincinnati." The Strategic Planning process will now continue by setting goals and objectives to meet the Mission.

In addition to updating its Mission, the Academy has revamped its Articles of Incorporation and Code of Regulations. Changes to these documents were necessitated by the change in the requirement of dual membership in the state and county medical societies in Ohio. The new documents will be available on the Academy's website later this month.

In addition to the Council induction ceremonies, the Academy honored its members who have practiced medicine for 50 years by presenting them with the OSMA's 50-Year Physician Awards. The 50-Year presentations were directed by OSMA Delegate Molly Katz, MD, and OSMAPAC Chair Marvin Rorick, MD, and highlighted with a video arrangement of the recipients' background.

UCCM to continue using Multiple Mini Interview **Physician volunteers needed**

The University of Cincinnati College of Medicine Admissions Committee plans to continue using the Multiple Mini Interview (MMI) process to select applicants to the College of Medicine. The MMI is a series of six to eight interview "stations" or encounters that last ten minutes and are centered on a scenario. Each station has its own interviewer (rater), and consequently, six to eight different individuals evaluate each student. The station scenarios do not test or assess scientific knowledge but instead focus on issues such as communication, ethics, critical thinking, teamwork and opinions on health care issues. Along with other unique strengths the MMI has, it allows the medical school to include medical students and community members in the admissions process at the interview stage.

UCCM is currently seeking medical school faculty, current students, and community members (physicians and non-physicians) to participate in the interviews, which are held September through March. All interviewers must complete a short training program. Interview participants with a background in hiring, judging character, working in teams, management, and leadership can provide insight and a unique perspective to the student selection process.

Any decision on interviewing or admitting a student is made solely by the Medical School Admissions Committee.
