



#### **Presenters**



Travis and Alissa Miller: When a 14-story building collapsed, odds of survival were almost zero. But victims and first responders didn't give up. It is a story of hope, of family, of fighting. The morning of Dec. 9, 2020, construction worker Travis Miller was working on a site in Adams County, Ohio, when the powerhouse collapsed, trapping him and his four coworkers under tons of steel, concrete and debris about two and half stories tall. After 95 days, Travis was able to go home to Grayson, Kentucky with his wife Alissa and two beautiful daughters.



Colonel Valerie Sams, MD serves as Critical Care Air Transport Team (CCAT) Training cadre and Director, Center for Sustainment of Trauma and Readiness Skills (CSTARS) Cincinnati. Following completion of her training, she deployed as the Trauma Czar for Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan from October 2015-April 2016. Following a second deployment in 2018, she assumed the role of Trauma Medical Director and Assistant Chief of Trauma and Suraical Critical Care in September 2019 and served in this role until June 2022. Col Sams also serves as a staff Trauma Surgeon at UC and WCH and a volunteer Associate Professor of Surgery for UC.






Andrea Hamel, MD is the Division Director of Clarence R McLain Jr and MD Endowed Chair for Medical Student Education. She studied Obstetrics and Gynecology, starting her Residency at the University of Connecticut then finishing her Doctoral Degree at the University of Cincinnati. She is board certified from the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology. Since 2017. She currently is the Medical Director for West Chester Hospitals OB Program.




Dustin Calhoun, MD FACEP is an Associate Professor at the University of Cincinnati, board certified in emergency and EMS medicine. He attended medical school at the Medical College of Georgia, emergency medicine residency in Charlotte, NC and completed an EMS fellowship at UC where he is now the Associate Director of the Division of EMS. He is the Medical Director for the Cincinnati Fire Department as well as multiple other Fire and SWAT/Police agencies. He is also active as a flight physician with Air Care and Mobile Care, the Medical Director for emergency management for UC




Care Surgeon and Surgical Intensivist.

Petra Warner, MD has 24 years of practice in adult and pediatric burn care, with special interest in burn reconstruction. She serves as the burn director at UC Medical Center, the only ABA verified burn center in Southern Ohio, and together with UC's dedicated multidisciplinary burn team, provides specialized burn care to the Tristate area. Dr. Warner is board certified in both General Surgery and Surgical Critical Care, she is a member of the American College of Surgeons and the American Burn Association.



Jason Schrager, MD is a general surgeon specializing in gallbladder, hernia disease and abdominal surgical problems. He received his medical degree and general surgery residency training at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine, followed by a fellowship in trauma and critical care at the University of Cincinnati. He has been Director of the Acute Care Surgery service since 2015 and also serves as an intensivist in the suraical ICU as well as specializing in surgery for the traumatically injured patient. Prior to his appointment at the University of Cincinnati, Dr. Schrager was a surgeon in the US Navy and served two tours in Afghanistan providing surgical support for the US Marine Corps, including serving as Officer-in-Charge of a forward deployed surgical team.





Justin Virojanapa, DO, is the Director of Neurosurgery for West Chester Hospital. He also serves as an Assistant Professor of Neurosurgery at the University of Cincinnati. Dr. Virojanapa completed his neurosurgery residency at Northwell Health in Manhasset, New York, before completing a postgraduate minimally invasive and complex spine surgery fellowship at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut. After initially returning to Northwell Health to serve as an Assistant Professor of Neurosurgery, Dr Virojanapa later rejoined his former mentor at Yale as UC faculty in 2020. He currently works clinically at both UCMC and West Chester as a Neurosurgeon.






